Malanda Lions Supporting Pensioners in our Community

With the price of rental accommodation going through the roof over the last year, it is becoming harder for pensioners to find an affordable place to live.

For those on a pension, it is near impossible to pay the high rents now being asked by landlords and have enough left over to put food on the table.

Malanda Lions have taken up the challenge of providing low-cost rental housing for those in our community on a pension. The need for affordable housing for these people is not a new idea for Malanda Lions, who first recognized this need some fifty years ago when they built their first pensioner unit. They now operate sixteen units in the town through their unit committee chaired by Lion Dom Parise and project manager, Lion Lionel Smith, whose dealings with the bureaucracies involved have led to great success.

The latest two-bedroom unit was completed this July and a tenant has taken up residence. Lionel was able to inform the club that a contract has been signed to build another two units on the site at Brown Street, Malanda which will commence in the next couple of weeks.

Lion Dom is often asked how can Malanda Lions afford to keep building these much-needed units. He explains that it was not an overnight decision but has been in the planning for seven years when the club purchased a double block of land close to town.

The first unit was built some fifty years ago by Lions Club members and it is their efforts that allow our present members to carry on their legacy. It has not been easy; in fact, it has been hard at times but the club saw a need and we just kept chipping away.

The club was able to take up the opportunities that came along which included a road closure adjacent to our Brown Street land which gave us another one thousand square meters to build units. This took two years to process but it was all worthwhile.

The Justice Department, Casino Grants proved to be another opportunity and the club was successful in winning a grant for \$100,000 this year toward building another unit. Our local Tableland Regional Council has recently introduced a program to encourage the building of medium-density housing by waiving infrastructure charges and Malanda Lions was their first applicant.

The saving for the club over the next three years will be around \$60,000.

The Brown Street development has three units completed and the club is planning to build another four units, all to be completed in the next three years taking our total number of units overall to twenty.

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The Brown Street complex are all free-standing units in a garden setting and come with solar power and air conditioning.

With the cost of electricity, the club recognized that it needed to support the air cons with solar power.

Rents are kept as low as possible and all of our tenants receive a rent subsidy from Centrelink or DVA of around \$75 per week.

Although the Malanda Lions unit assets are valued at over two million dollars the project is about the elderly in our community and providing a suitable place for them to reside in their later years.

Malanda Lions President, Cade Blakesley said the demand for the Lions units has been above anything we could have imagined.

We are presently receiving one or two applications a week and some are very sad stories. One of the things that our tenants appreciate is that they have the security of

tenure.

It is the tenant, their family, and their doctor who decides when they need to move on and that is the way it should be. Cade said one of the things that he likes about the Lions units is that we know our tenants by their first name and they have become de facto members of our club.


Leadership and training

Likewise, as a district we cannot provide our members with the best options in support due to lack of funds etc by being in transition. We certainly try our best but there are limitations. It is therefore up to all of us to do our part to our best ability to grow our membership in a positive direction. From a member retention aspect; please talk to your resigning members as to why they are really leaving instead of just dropping them.

Home Hill Visit - 1st Vice District Governor Jo Lynes



What to say when asked **How** 'Sausages Save Sight'?

LEHP provides education programs to encourage all Australians to have **Regular Eye Examinations** to detect undiagnosed vision conditions and the effects of Diabetic Retinopathy, Age-related Macular Degeneration and Glaucoma.

LEHP also conducts **Vision Screenings** in schools, sporting clubs and community centres throughout the country to detect vision problems in children, so they will not fall behind in school because of poor vision and can have the best possible start in life.

Children's Screenings have found that 1 in 5 children have an undetected vision condition.

Diabetic Retinopathy, small blood vessel complications which can lead to blurred and patchy vision, vision loss and blindness, can be developed equally by both Type 1 and Type 2 diabetes sufferers.

Age-related Macular Degeneration effects the macular, which is part of the retina, situated at the back of the eye and removes central vision.

Glaucoma is a condition where the nerve cells that transmit information from the eye to the brain become damaged and slowly takes over an individual's peripheral (or side) vision.

Once vision is lost through these conditions it cannot be restored, however there are simple and effective methods of controlling these and preventing any further vision loss.

In fact 90% of vision loss in Australia is avoidable or treatable.

Too many Australians are losing their sight, when it didn't have to be the case.

Vision Loss can happen to anyone at any age so early detection is vital.

The **Lions Eye Health Program** message is to get your eyes tested and make sure children are also tested.
