Corona Virus Restrictions

The following advice is provided by Legal Officer PCC David Skinner OAM

Hopefully it will provide some assistance for clubs for which this matter is an issue.

- (1) Each Lions Club, at a General Meeting, may determine whether or not non fully vaccinated members are permitted to physically attend Club meetings and other activities. Such a determination should be made by a resolution adopted by a majority vote.
- (2) Should a Club determine to decline physical attendance by Club members who are not fully vaccinated, steps should be taken, if at all possible, to conduct meetings via zoom or a like provider in order to permit non fully vaccinated members to continue to participate in Club discussions and, where possible, Club activities.

Alternatively, it may be that physical meetings could be arranged in such a manner that vaccinated and non-vaccinated members may physically attend but retain a mutually agreed "social distance" to avoid any chance of infection. Although not ideal, such an arrangement would continue to ensure communication and participation of all members.

Should meetings or activities be arranged in premises to which no entry restrictions apply, it seems to me that the attendance of each fully vaccinated member would be a matter for his or her sole judgement. Equally so, any invitee to a Club meeting should have the right to enquire as to whether all members to be present are vaccinated. The acceptance or declination of the invitation would be a matter for the judgement of the invitee.

I certainly accept that any restrictions may adversely affect our membership – at a time when membership is a critical matter and of extreme importance.

Every effort should be made, if restrictions are put in place, to communicate with those members who are unable to attend regularly and let them know that they are valued members of the Club. Needless to say, all members should be encouraged to participate in all decisions affecting the activities of their Club.



Revised Lions Child Safe Policy



Dear Lions

Council has recently adopted a revised Child Safe Policy and Leo Child Safe Policy template. My thanks to the many Lions and Leos that contributed to the work that was guided by <u>Australian Child Safe consultancy.</u> Special thanks to PDG Donna Hedges in her role as National Child Safe Officer and her team.

You will find the revised policy on the National website here. https://lionsclubs.org.au/our-governance-structure/md201-child-safe-policy-resources/

Although you can read it in a web browser, it is fully bookmarked and easiest to navigate if you download the document. In order to assist you with understanding and working with the revised policy, we will shortly be launching a number of webinars to be conducted by our consultants and these will continue throughout the year to provide an opportunity to any Lions who wishes to find out more about the policy.

Feedback from the webinars will also be used to continuously refine the policy.

In brief, however:

- The Policy is colour-coded to detail common elements, and particular sections with reference to the three youth programs Leo of the Year, Youth of the Year and Youth Exchange.
- Leo Clubs are the responsibility of a Lions Club and are controlled and managed by that Club. For this reason, they do not fall within the scope of the National Policy. However, it is essential that the sponsoring Lions Club develop its own Child Safe Policy, reflecting the activities of the club and the rules within your state. A template Leo Child Safe Policy is provided to assist sponsoring Lions Clubs.

We are currently developing additional materials to implement the policy including revised position statements and an improved feedback form on the website to manage complaints.

Implementation

Although the policy is based on the original policy, there are some changes that will need to be accommodated in the current programs for consistency. Program leaders should do their best to accommodate the changes, however it is appreciated that it may take some time to re-engineer some of our processes. I will be convening a meeting in the next couple of weeks with the chairpersons of these programs to work through these requirements.

Thank you again for your assistance. Providing safe, effective and enjoyable programs for, and with, young people is so important to the future or our organization and one of the most worthwhile things we can do as Lions.




