Why report service?

Strengthen storytelling

Details give stories power. Saying you fed 87 families is more powerful than saying you organized a food drive.

Saying your club contributed 1,265 volunteer hours last year is more powerful than saying your club serves the community. When your club reports service, you collect the details needed to share powerful stories of your club's impact.

Inform decisions

Documented club achievements reveal what's working and what's not. For example, what if your diabetes education program is growing in attendance, but your annual club fundraiser is shrinking? Reviewing past service reports helps your club make better decisions, including choosing service activities and setting realistic goals.

Inspire service

Your reported service projects can be viewed within your district and around the world. That means your club's creativity and impact can inspire Lions and Leos to embrace new causes and serve in new ways. Reports also help Lions International staff identify best practices to share globally.

Grow partnerships

Collaborating with other organizations in your community is a great way to increase the

visibility, reach and quality of your service projects. When approaching potential partners, your club's service reports provide tangible evidence of your club's effectiveness to help persuade other organizations to join with you.

Enlighten leaders

High levels of service reporting are a sign of healthy clubs, zones and districts. Knowledge of your club's service history provides invaluable insight to current and future club officers. In addition, district, zone and Global Action Team leaders can best support your club when they understand how clubs in their area serve their communities.

Be proud

Service data gives us the ability to communicate how **We Serve** around the world. For example, in 2021, Lions and Leos served more than 350 million people! We can take pride in that achievement thanks to the leaders who reported over 1 million service activities. Through service reporting, your club joins in that pride and is eligible for service awards.



Leadership and training



One of our district goals is to get every lions club reporting service through MyLion. It's the way we gather the data we need to tell the world about all the awesome things we do in our communities.

On October 13 the district will be running an online training

session for MyLion. If you want to attend but

have never used zoom before - send me an email so I can help you (glt@lions201q2.org).

October 27 the district will be running an online session for new lions. This orientation course will help our newest members become more familiar with our association and give a forum for the discussion of ideas. All lions who have sponsored a new member in the last 6-12 months are encouraged to join along with their new lions.

Service Report

For our clubs', reporting service is the final step in our service journey. Reporting service can be a point of pride that can be celebrated and creates a database of the great projects done in a given community. Plus, clubs that report service become eligible for service awards and other forms of recognition. Remember we have the incentive this year that ONE club will be given the opportunity to win the \$500.

Reporting Service Helps:

How you may ask, by

- Accurately measure our global impact
- Identify the best ways to work together
- Bring attention to the great work of Lions
- Ensure clubs' service is supported in the best ways possible

Therefore we ask that you report your Service. we have many people scattered around our district that can help if you need help reporting you only need ask.

I am happy to report that we currently have 56% of our clubs reporting. Congratulations to those clubs but, DG Michael has set a goal of having 100% of clubs reporting.so still a bit of work to do.

The challenge is on and as they say let the games begin.

We are now looking towards Lap the Map which is for Diabetes awareness. I suggest you get your clubs plan in place now.



District Cabinet in Profile - Irene Braddick

Hi, I'm Irene Braddick and I am the coordinator for Q2 and the Q representative for Multiple District for the Lions Eye Health Program (LEHP).

I have been in Lions for 16 years and am the Secretary of Tully Lions Club.

The Adult side of the LEHP program is an informative one, with lots of pamphlets available.

We suggest that one gets an eye test at least once every two years, if not sooner.

The Children's Vision Screening Program is where we go into the schools and screen students with a Visual Acuity Lea Chart, Colour Vision Screening, Depth Perception Fly Stereo and our Spot Vision Screener (Welch Allyn Camera) which screens for



abnormalities such as Myopia, Hyperopia, Astigmatism, Anisometropia and Binocular Vision. We can also screen at different community groups like Scouts/Girl Guides, Sports groups etc.

I am the registrar/director of the Youth Camp at Camp Kanga. Owing to COVID there has not been any International Youth Exchange for a few years, but we have run a Queensland Camp and looking to do that again next year.

My parents were both members of Lions in New Zealand where I lived until 30 years ago when Martin and I came across to develop and run a Redclaw Crayfish Farm at Feluga.

After 15 years, we sold that and retired to South Mission Beach.

I volunteer at the Angel Care Opp Shop and Meals on Wheels, and am the Mission Arts Secretary.

I was proud to be named the Citizen of the Year for 2022 in the Cassowary Coast Region. I love travelling, bush walking and reading.

Malanda Lions always go in boots and all when they do a project and the 2023 Calendar is no different.

The club has employed a professional photographer to gather together a set of photographs under the heading "The Place

Where We Live" that highlight the beautiful Atherton Tablelands. Lion Graham King heads up the team which have been able to obtain a number of grants to offset the cost of production.

This will enable the club to reduce the retail sale price of each calendar to \$15.00 each. Lion Graham has been able to use a helicopter to get some beautiful photos of waterfalls, lakes and rolling hills that would have been near impossible to obtain by any other means.

Our club has been able to value add on this project by having our professional photographer engage students in learning all there is to know about their cameras and the art of taking the perfect photo.

One or more of the students go along on each shoot, tutored by the professional. We are hoping that some of their photos are good enough to adorn the pages of the calendar.

The Lions Calendar will be for sale in Tourist Information Centres and local businesses where they can be purchased by visitors as a memento of their time in our area. Many are sold to locals for Christmas presents for friends and family and some are just purchased for the pictures.

The club see this project as supporting our community although we have noticed that it does instil a sense of pride by locals in their town and community.

When you live in a place such as the Southern Tablelands it is easy to forget just how lucky we are and the Lions calendar is a gentle reminder of that.

The 75th anniversary of Lions Clubs in Australia was recognised with tree planting and cakecutting in Cairns during the ANZI weekend.






